PAWS Bark Park

A Special Social Canine Community for You & Your Best Friend

The opening of the PAWS Bark Park will be announced during 2010. The Park is approximately one acre and located adjacent to the PAWS Pet Adoption Center at 5042 Mattie Street in Morehead City.

West Carteret High Schools' Shop Class with teacher Dan Varner made the PAWS Bark Park "Gatehouse" their project and brought it nearly to completion prior to school's end.

Features include: six foot fencing, separate large and small dog areas, shaded seating area, water fountain, public restroom, multiple waste stations, key card entry, secure double gated dog entry, and ample parking.

Some benefits of the park are that it provides a way for dog owners living in apartments, condos, or homes with small yards to let their dogs run off leash in a fenced area. The park also provides a way for elderly and disabled dog owners to exercise their pet. For many the park will provide an opportunity to socialize with other people and their dogs.

Dog parks help make a dog a better pet and neighbor because an exercised and well socialized dog is less likely to bark excessively, destroy property, or become aggressive. Dog parks also help create a greater sense of community by bringing people of all ages and from all walks of life together with a common interest.

As leash laws become more prevalent and more strictly enforced and as human population demands reduce the amount of dog-friendly spaces, owners are turning to dog parks as alternatives to exercise and socialize their canine companions. Dogs are free to run, play socialize, explore, and just be dogs.

Bark Park Club members will be on their honor to keep a clean, disease free park for our canine companions and fellow members to enjoy. Proper waste disposal is the single most important item to ensure the success of the PAWS Bark Park.

The annual Bark Park Club membership will be seventy-five dollars for the first family dog and five dollars for each additional family dog. A visiting dog package will also be available.

Owners will be asked to provide a PAWS Bark Park Club Health report for each dog. Vaccinations required are: Rabies, DHPP, & Bordetella. A negative stool sample (parasites) is also required on the health report. The report must be completed by a licensed veterinarian for each dog prior to admission.

The PAWS Bark Park is a happy place where dogs (*under voice command*) can run and play off-leash. The park is operated by Bark Park Club members, PAWS members, and PAWS volunteers.



President's Letter

It has been an eventful year for PAWS. Just about a year ago we finished Phase I of the PAWS Adoption & Education Center, and very soon we will be opening the PAWS Bark Park. For those who have not had a chance to visit the Adoption Center recently, you will now find a nicely fenced park with a beautiful and functional gatehouse. Much of the labor for the gatehouse was provided by the West Carteret High School Shop Class.

Our next challenge is to fund our long term goal of building Phase II (no-kill shelter) and completing The Adoption Center. In the meantime we will continue our rescue and adoption programs. Since we currently rely on fosters for these programs, we are limited in the number animals we can help. That is why it is important to keep focused on our long term goal. To meet this challenge, we will utilize a grant writer to locate and apply for money that may be available from a variety of sources, as well as continue our other fundraising activities.

With our economy in its present condition, raising the money necessary to complete this project will not be easy. When we are able to raise the \$1.5 million needed to build the shelter, we estimate that we will also need about \$150,000 yearly to operate it. We currently do not generate this much revenue, but have received some encouraging offers of future help from other sources. While these are daunting tasks going forward, I believe that, with the support of our membership and the community, we can and will succeed.

Are You My Foster Mom?

Dogs and cats, who may otherwise be destroyed at an overcrowded shelter, are temporarily placed with you, their Foster Family, until a Forever Family is found.

We only ask that you give your foster pet food, shelter, and love. Medical expenses and all pet supplies/food are provided by PAWS. The lives you save, and the love you get will warm your heart. If you have children the lessons they learn from Fostering will enrich their lives!

There are different ways to participate in the PAWS Foster program. Sometimes a cat or dog can be with us for a month or two, maybe longer, and an open-ended commitment is required. We also need short-term emergency fosters who can take in animals for a short time while longer-term care is arranged.

Nearing 500 Rescued & Adopted Pets!



All of these cases have touched our hearts over the years. It takes hard work, dedication, patience, tears, and a lot of volunteer hours to get to where we are today and where we're going tomorrow!

It's really wonderful looking back through our records of animals rescued and placed in loving homes. We often remember the pet's name more readily than the owner and often recognize them out and about in the community! We began our journey using PetFinder in late 2002 with our first adoptions in 2003. Can you remember Dana and Desiree the dogs? How about our favorite pair of Thrift Store felines Kona & Coki?

All of the critters rescued and adopted into homes by PAWS have been vetted, vaccinated, spayed and neutered. Saving close to five hundred animals from a shelter or some other unknown fate is quite remarkable and **we're very proud. It's reported that one female cat that has a litter of six together can ultimately produce 420,000 cats in only seven years! Only one in twelve of those 420,000 will find it's way into a home.**

Not all of the animals PAWS rescues or places for adoption have been dogs and cats. We have placed horses, goats, ferrets, chinchillas, birds, bunnies, and a few guinea pigs! None of this could be possible without the PAWS Foster homes. Until such time that we have our own facility to house animals, and probably even after we do Foster homes will be vital to our being. Ask any of our past or present Foster families and they will tell you how rewarding this can be!

Hurricane (Earl) Shelter Report

Newport Middle School serves as Carteret County's only "Companion" (pet friendly) Hurricane/Disaster Shelter. As hurricane Earl decided what to do PAWS Volunteers, CCEMS, and Red Cross were busy setting up the shelter. The Red Cross reported over eighty people used the shelter during Earl. They brought with them five dogs and one cat!

PAWS volunteers work all year at events (prior to and during hurricane season) asking folks to pre-register their pets for the shelter in case they need to use it. This gives us a general idea of what kind of numbers we might expect along with types of animals that might come. CCEMS reports approximately three hundred and fifty people & pets pre-registered. As we learned from hurricane Katrina, most people will not leave pets behind which creates danger and concern for the safety of not only the pets but especially the owners. Quick Facts

- Since the last newsletter 64 pets have been placed into wonderful and loving homes. Another 13 are currently in Foster homes waiting patiently.
- Over \$7,000 in grants have been extended during 2010 from the Dr. Kirk Budd Memorial Grant Fund. Cases are submitted by participating area veterinarians for emergency procedures with a good to excellent prognosis. Since our last newsletter 4 sets of doggie wheels have been made possible to help get those pooches mobile again!
- A total of 50 *in memory* or *in honor of* bricks have been sold and are being placed in the front walkway of the PAWS Pet Adoption and Education Center. This is a wonderful fund raiser for PAWS bringing in \$3750 so far.
